A EUROPEAN GREEN DEAL: ENVIRONMENT

- A Biodiversity Strategy for 2030
- EU Biodiversity Strategy for 2030 in March 2020 in preparation for the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity in Kunming, China, in October 2020
- Follow up with concrete measures in 2021 to address the main drivers of biodiversity loss
- A new **EU Forest Strategy** in 2020
- Measures to support deforestation-free value chains from 2020
- "Zero-pollution" strategy to preserve the health of EU citizens from environmental degradation and pollution, addressing air and water quality, hazardous chemicals, industrial emissions, pesticides and endocrine disruptors
- Zero pollution action plan for air, water and soil in 2021
- Address industrial pollution from large industrial installations in 2021
- Chemicals strategy for sustainability in summer 2020



THE EUROPEAN GREEN DEAL:

Europe as the a world leader in circular economy and clean technologies

- a New Circular Economy Action Plan
- "Farm to Fork Strategy" on sustainable food
- A strategy for green financing and a Sustainable Europe Investment Plan
- Europe to lead on the issue of single use plastics.




The Commission presented its proposal for a directive on single-use plastic products (SUPs) in May 2018.


Directive (EU) 2019/904 on the reduction of the impact of certain plastic products on the environment published on 5 June 2019

3 July 2021: Transposition into national law

Proposed EU-wide measures on water reuse for agricultural irrigation

Minimum requirements for reuse of treated waste water from urban waste water treatment plants

(covering microbiological elements and monitoring requirements)

Risk management

(any additional hazards must be addressed for water reuse to be safe)

Increased transparency

(access to information online about water reuse practice in their Member States)

Environmental Assessments

- a cornerstone of environmental governance

Environmental Impact Assessment Directive (2014/52/EU)

applies to a wide range of defined public and private projects (dates back to 1985)

- Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Directive was amended in 2014 to simplify the rules for assessing the potential effects of projects on the environment. It is in line with the drive for smarter regulation, so it reduces the administrative burden.
 - Strategic Environmental Assessment Directive (2001/42/EC)

on the assessment of the effects of certain plans and programs on the environment

REFIT Evaluation of the SEA Directive

Timeframe: July 2017 - December 2019

Evaluation has examined the extent to which the SEA Directive is fit for purpose by looking into what works and what can be improved, the extent to which the objectives of the Directive have been achieved and why some elements or features are successful or not.

The SEA Directive remains fit for purpose.
