Fastest **growing region**, with positive demography and economy

Regional cooperation is improved, **political support** for the regional cooperation is high Long-term cooperation with international partners exist and positive

Environment and Water Cooperation key elements of sustainable development of Central Asia

Political environment tremendously improved in Central Asia last two years: 3 high level meetings and 4 international conferences with focus on regional cooperation, including environment and water Environment and Water became issue of cooperation - not competition

Pragmatic & concrete measures are required for building up durable and sustainable environment and water cooperation

Central Asia's Environmental Challenges

- Water challenges: reduction of quality and quantity, growing competition for water resources, degradation of water environment and increasing of frequency of natural disasters of water nature
 - Land degradation: Desertification, salinization and degradation of quality, soil contamination
- **Biodiversity losses and ecosystems degradation**: reduction of numbers and species, reduced environmental services
- Degradation of Environment in Cities: air pollution, waste and industrial pollution
- Climate change: higher and longer heat waves, melting of glaciers and increased number of droughts, floods.




Environment for Central Asia Process – initiated by CAREC in 2017

Goal: The EfCA process aims to create conditions for complementary and interactive actions of national, regional, international and academic institutions at the regional level on environment and water management, and to avoid duplication of efforts.

Benefits:

- Streamlined and coordinated mechanism of efforts done in Central Asia.
- Advanced effectiveness of international support and mobilization of financial, expert and technological resources to the Central Asian region
- Increased synergy of various regional projects and initiatives (REAP, ASBP, regional Water Strategy)
- Enhanced promotion of common regional vision of CA countries in international processes (including Environment for Europe" process)
- Integration of scientific and research results into decisionmaking level





- Develop and pre-agree conceptual paper on Strategic Plan with both
 (i) national and international partners
- Accommodate, streamline and locate major CAREC initiatives in
 2013-2017 into strategic plan: CAIEF, Leadership programme, process environment for central Asia, conventions, Nexus approach, basin work, climate partnership, etc.
- Make a breakthrough and out of box imagination: new roles, opportunities, institutional set up, geographical extension

Make a change in governance and management: (i) divide daily management (support) from programmatic guidance, (ii) representativeness and supportive governance structure and (iii) loyalty and support from partners, experts and staff

EU-Central Asia Environmental Partnership

Experiences and lessons from past: more of **long-term and programmatic support**
