Background

- 1. Support for regional experts in preparation of investment projects in environment, climate change and water is a priority defined by the EU-Central Asia Cooperation Platform Action Plan
- Decision to develop Investor Guide and Regional Knowledge Centre Web platform for Central Asia was taken during the 6th Meeting of the Working Group in July 2017 in Astana
- 3. The following key capacity building and training areas were identified:
 - International financial institutions (IFI) guidelines and procedures;
 - Key factors and diagnostic tools in the identification and design of investment projects;
 - IFI project cycle and project preparation and appraisal.












Investor Guide: objectives

The main purpose – to provide structured guidance for Central Asian professionals on development of bankable project proposals

It provides:








Knowledge Centre web platform: objectives

The main purpose – to support development and preparation of environmental projects in Central Asia providing regional stakeholders with relevant information and guidance, all available in one place.














Interactive platform: one of the key benefits – opportunity to connect directly to the project experts and IFIs and get answers to questions














User area: allows access to additional features, like more contacts for financial institutions, more projects in the data base and opportunity to store and exchange project-specific folders and files








Investors




