



Objectives of the Strategy

Central Asia: Key Landscapes for Conservation





LARGER THAN TIGERS

>10,000 species of higher plants (20% endemic)
>1,000 species of vertebrates
>300 threatened species







Threats in Central Asia:

- Habitat loss
- Habitat degradation
- Over-exploitation and illegal wildlife trade

- Promote a greener economy






